Sources and Notes: As Table 97a. Percentages for the years to 1987/88 are for secure lettings to homeless households only. In addition, the majority of the relatively small number of non-secure lettings during that period were made to homeless households. From 1988/89 onwards the percentages relate to both secure and non-secure lettings. This change is necessary to reflect the increasing numbers of non-secure lettings made to new tenants in recent years. In 2003/04 non-secure lettings in England accounted for some 61 per cent of all lettings to new tenants, despite in that year the exclusion of non-secure lettings to homeless households.
