From 2011/12, the table reports on homeless applicants 'accepted as full duty applicants'. Previously, the table reported on applicants 'awarded priority status'. The two terms are essentially the same, but because of changes in management procedures and a greater range of possible outcome decisions than were recorded prior to 2011/12, figures from 2011/12 onwards for those accepted as full duty applicants are not directly comparable with previous totals.
