Gross household disposable income (GDHI) is RPHQ and is the amount of money that all of the individuals in the household sector have available for spending or saving after they have paid direct and indirect taxes and received any direct benefits. The household sector includes all individuals, including people living in institutions and the self-employed but now excludes non-profit bodies such as charities.

2. Households' final consumption expenditure is ABJQ. Both household consumption and GDHI figures for all years have been revised as part of the modified GDP methodology.

3. The 'savings ratio' is the ratio of savings to household disposable income.

4. For the years to 2005 the increases are the average annual increase over the previous five years.

5. Constant prices calculated based on the Composite Price Index (January 1974 = 100).
